Seven-Day Journaling Questions: Chains and Great Escapes
Read the story again - Acts 16:16-34

Day 1: Recognizing Our Chains

Write about a time when worship uplifted your spirit or shifted your focus.

Day 4: God's Presence in Trials

God was present with Paul and Silas in the prison. Reflect on a time when you felt God's presence during a trial.

How did that experience impact your faith and understanding of God's character?

Day 5: Responding to Difficulties

When faced with adversity, how do you typically respond? Consider the reactions of Paul and Silas.

Write about a time when you chose to respond with faith instead of fear.

What did you learn from that experience?

Day 6: Sharing Your Faith

After the miraculous escape, the jailer came to believe in Christ. How can sharing your own faith story impact others?

Write about an experience where sharing your faith influenced someone's life or your own.

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Day 7: Embracing Freedom

Paul and Silas experienced a great escape from their chains.

What does spiritual freedom mean to you?

Reflect on the areas in your life where you desire greater freedom.

Our daredevil of the week was the one and only Houdini!

Harry Houdini's performances can be intricately related to the themes of faith and escape in several compelling ways:
